Overview

The quality of clinical supervision is one key influence on the quality of the clinical placement, and ultimately, on the calibre of the health practitioner.

The National Clinical Supervision Support Program (CSSP) aims to expand clinical supervision capacity and competence across the educational and training continuum by supporting measures to:

- Prepare and train clinical supervisors.
- Deliver and develop a competent clinical supervision workforce, which delivers quality training.

As part of this program, Health Workforce Australia developed and published the overarching National Clinical Supervision Support Framework and the National Clinical Supervision Competency Resources – Validation Edition. These documents provide the foundation for the National Clinical Supervision Skills Initiative Program.

The Tasmanian Clinical Supervision Support Program

The Tasmanian CSSP will deliver a range of interprofessional education and training opportunities for new and existing clinical supervisors across Tasmania as facilitated through the The Tasmanian Clinical Education Network (TCEN).
